#### **4 MISTAKES TO AVOID**

MISTAKE #1: Choosing a Hoarding Cleanup Company based on low price.

Low price can be the bait that attracts your phone call. But once the sales rep gets into your home, he pressures you into a much more expensive job. They offer a cheap price and then, once they're in your home, they pressure you into buying "add-ons." It's as if you were buying a car and found that the dealer was charging you extra for the tires and steering wheel.

MISTAKE #2: Choosing a Hoarding Cleanup company based on a single telephone call.

Instead, invite the person to your home and ask for a specific written quote. Then you'll know exactly what the Hoarding Cleanup Company recommends. It is impossible to understand the hoarding situation until the company can see the space and meet all of the people involved. An accurate estimate should be clear and easy to understand. Hoarding is complex, but the pricing should not be complex. A company that uses a set daily rate is likely benefiting the company more than the client. Often times there are additional charges for supplies, labor and dump fees.

MISTAKE #3: Choosing a Hoarding Cleanup Company that doesn't offer a money-back guarantee.

In our view, every Hoarding Cleanup company should be fully accountable for its work. And if you aren't pleased with the job in every way, you shouldn't have to pay for it. Period. Not all Hoarding Cleanup companies offer a guarantee." Ask the Hoarding Cleanup company if he offers a money-back guarantee and then make sure the Hoarding Cleanup Company includes the guarantee on the written quotation.

#### MISTAKE #4: Choosing a Hoarding Cleanup Company without getting testimonials from past clients.

Any Hoarding Cleanup company can say anything about their past jobs. And, sadly, some of what they say may not be true. Make sure you ask for references or read comments from current customers so you can depend on the Hoarding Cleanup company and their work.

### STEP #3: Ask questions.

The way you learn about a company is to ask specific questions and listen carefully to the answers. Here are eight tough questions to ask a Hoarding Cleanup company before you start the process.

- 1. What training do your employees have to deal with hoarding?
- 2. Can you give me a written quote/contract?
- 3. How does your team handle emotional challenges and objections for the client.
- 4. Do you charge for the initial consultation?
- 5. How many people do you send out?
- 6. What type of insurance do you have?

**STEP #4:** Once you're satisfied that you're working with an honest, competent professional, invite him to your home and ask for a specific quotation in writing. A written quotation gives you the assurance that you know exactly what your job will cost — no surprises.

The purpose behind these steps is to empower you with the information you need to make a wise decision in choosing a Hoarding Cleanup professional. The proper care in your home (and all coverings in your home for that matter) is essential to creating a healthy indoor environment for you and your family, and this decision should never be taken lightly. These guidelines will help you to locate an ethical and excellent Hoarding Cleanup company in your town.

Knowing what questions to ask is essential in avoiding problems. Here's what they say you should expect:

- No hidden costs. Expect itemized costs for services and firm prices before technicians begin each portion
  of the work sold. Consumers should never feel pressured to accept anything more than the services they
  request.
- Customer satisfaction. Cleaning firms should offer workmanship guarantees in writing.
- Proper licensing and insurance. Make sure they have a valid business license, general liability and auto insurance, workers compensation to protect all of their employees, a bond and are OSHA compliant with background checks for all employees.
- Customized services with options to meet your specific needs. Their services offered should include:
  - A method for removing clutter (dumpster, dump trucks, bagster, etc)
  - Cleaning and/or organizing services
  - Offering a customized plan unique to your situation
- Mental Health Training. Hoarding is a complex issue and requires a team who is knowledgeable and
  experienced. While most hoarding clean up businesses are not licensed therapist, they should be trained by
  a mental health professional to handle objections and understand the mental health risks and warning signs.

Hiring a company who is solely focused on removing the clutter without involving the client is risky to the mental health of the client and/or family.

  company. Clients often need plumbers, electricians, roofers, etc to make the home safe to live in. Find a
  company that has an established network of providers who understand hoarding and show compassion and
  care.
